Section Business Plan and Budget Generation

Introduction

The relevant section of the Board of District Vice Presidents MOP [SEC8.1 (3) refers] requires all ISA Regular Sections to submit a Business Plan and Budget as one of the requirements to maintain active status. This presentation will explore the relevant issues concerning

that necessity for a Business Plan and Budget but also the practical reasons which make such vital to a business operation. The subject will be approached generally with respect to a non-profit organisation and specifically from the direction of the Ireland Section. In this way it is expected that other Sections can acquire that which is relevant to their own operation.

Business Survivability

A business can be defined as a legally recognised organisation designed to provide goods and/or services to consumers. This definition can be further divided into those which operate for profit and for non-profit (or not-for-profit) with a non-profit organisation being defined as that which does not aim to make a profit, and which is not a public body. On these definitions the activity of an ISA Section can therefore be considered to be a business. The Ireland Section operates as non-profit.

The latest statistics from the Small Business Administration (SBA) show that "two-thirds of new employer establishments survive at lease two years,

and 44 percent survive at least four years". This is a far cry from the previous longheld belief that 50 percent of businesses fail in the first year and 95 percent fail within five years.

Better success rates notwithstanding however, a significant percentage of businesses – new and existing – do fail. There are many expert opinions on the reasons for these failures and on the mechanisms to be employed to keep a business operating soundly. Consider the following.

Key Factors

These are seen as the personal characteristics of a good business driver and have been shown that, where absent, can be the start of business failure.

You have a passion and love for what you are doing and strongly believe, following educated study and thorough investigation, that your product or service would fulfil a real need in

the marketplace. You are physically fit and possess the needed mental stamina to withstand potential challenges. Often overlooked, less-than-robust health has been responsible for more than a few business failures. You have drive. determination, patience and a positive attitude. When others throw in the towel, vou are more determined than ever. Failures don't defeat you. You learn from vour mistakes, and use these lessons to succeed the next time around.

Poor Management

Neglect of a business can also be its downfall. Care must be taken to regularly study, organise, plan and control all activities of the business operation. This includes the continuing study of market research and review of customer data, an area which may be more prone to disregard once a business has been established.

It is critical for all businesses to have a business plan. Many small businesses fail because of fundamental shortcomings in their business planning. It must be realistic and based on accurate, current information and educated projections for the future.

Over-Expansion

A leading cause of busi-

Insufficient Capital

A common fatal mistake for many business failures is having insufficient operating funds. Business owners underestimate how much money is needed and they are forced to close before they even have had a fair chance to succeed. They also may have an unrealistic expectation of incoming revenues from sales. This

means you will need enough funds to cover all costs until income begins to flow.

Lack of Planning

Anyone who has ever been in charge of a successful major event knows that were it not for their careful, methodical, strategic planning and hard work success would not have followed. The same could be said of most business

A successful manager is also a good leader who creates a work climate that encourages productivity. He or she has a skill at hiring competent people, training them and is able to delegate. A good leader is also skilled at strategic thinking, able to make a vision a reality, and able to confront change, make transitions, and envision new possibilities for the future.

ness failure, overexpansion often happens when business owners confuse success with how fast they can expand their business. A focus on slow and steady growth is optimum.

At the same time, you do not want to repress

growth. If expansion is warranted after careful review, research and analysis, identify what and who you need to add in

order for your business to grow. Then with the right systems and people in place, you can focus on the growth of your business, not on doing everything in it yourself.

No Website

Simply put, if you have a business today, you need a website.

At the very least, every business should have a professional looking and well-designed website that enables users to easily find out about their business and how to avail them-

selves of their products and services. Later, additional ways to generate revenue on the website can be added; i.e., selling ad space, drop-shipping products, or recommending affiliate products.

Business Plan

A business plan is a formal statement of a set of business goals, the reasons why they are believed attainable, and the plan for reaching those goals. It may also contain background information about the organisation or team attempting to reach

those goals.

Non-profit business plans tend to focus on the organisational mission which is the basis for their non-profit status although they may also focus on optimising revenue. In non-profit organisations, creative tensions may develop in the effort to balance mission with revenue.

Business plans are decision-making tools. There is no fixed content for a business plan. Rather the content and format of the business plan is determined by the goals and

audience. A business plan should contain whatever information is needed to decide whether or not to pursue a goal.

For example, a business plan for a non-profit might discuss the fit between the business operation and the organisation's mission.

"...a good business plan can help to make a good business credible, understandable, and attractive to someone who is unfamiliar with the business. Writing a good business plan can't guarantee success, but it can go a long way toward reducing the odds of failure."
